COVID-19 Lateral Flow Test information for Parent / Carer

We shared information with you via ParentMail on 19th January regarding the Lateral Flow Test process.



Parental permission is not required for a student who is aged 16 or over.

Currently we will be testing staff and students who are in school. Please do not send your son/daughter into school for a test. On the day of your son/daughter's test, they will bring home a card containing a QR code and a barcode allocated to him/her. You can use this information to register on the online NHS system. Registration will need to be completed within 24 hours of your son/daughter having the test to ensure you receive the results.
