Information regarding lateral flow testing and travelling to Sixth Form

Thank you to all students and families who continue to take LFT at home twice weekly, this is helping to keep us all safe and well.

Below is some information from Dudley Local Authority, which they have asked us to share with you.

Students must not attend school and must inform us if;

- they or members of their household have covid-19 symptoms and they should [arrange a PCR test](#)
- they or members of their household have tested positive on LFD or PCR in the last 10 days (anyone with a positive LFD should book a confirmatory PCR test)
- they have been told to isolate as a contact. Close contacts can now book a PCR test as a contact [book a test](#)
- they feel unwell
- they should be isolating for 10 days following recently returning from overseas.

Students should continue with twice weekly LFT testing and report the result to school through TestRegister (<https://testregister.co.uk/login>) and NHS <https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result>

If families would like to take part in the national test at home programme – lateral flow testing kits are available via the .gov website [here](#)

Face coverings in school should continue to be worn (except for students who are exempt)

It is expected that face coverings will no longer be required to be worn in classrooms, or by students in other communal areas, at Step 3 of the roadmap, which will be **no earlier than 17th May**.

Those who are currently exempt from wearing face coverings, including students who are speaking to or providing assistance to someone who relies on lip reading, clear sound or facial expression to communicate, will remain so. <https://www.gov.uk/government/news/face-coverings-in-schools-and-colleges-to-remain-in-place>

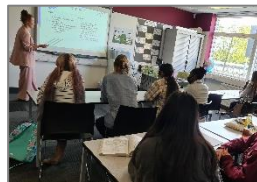


Evening Classes

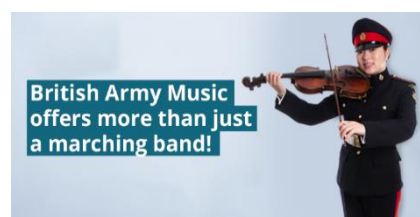
